Fall Financials ATA GLANCE

Financial aid funds will begin applying toward fall bills on **Friday**, **August 16th**. This will occur for students who have accepted financial aid and completed their financial aid file (no outstanding financial aid to-do items to complete). This will continue to occur 4 days a week for the remainder of the semester, so students who have missed the August 16th date will have their financial aid funds paid toward their bill as soon as all financial aid to do items are completed. and processed.

The Student Financial Services office has posted fall tuition and fees to the myUCCS Portal on July 28. **Students can now log into their myUCCS portal and view their balances**. Simply click on the "Student Financial Services" link and then "View Your Balance" in the dropdown menu.

The Fall 2019 census date (the date when the fall bill is due in full) is **September 12th**. Students can connect with the Student Financial Services office to sign up for an automatic deduction payment plan to split up their payments over a period of months (if needed). FERPA stands for the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act passed in 1974. FERPA is a federal law that protects the privacy of students' education records, including their financial aid files. It governs the release of these records and the access to these records. In other words, a college or university and its ents, including the Financial Aid Office, must have authorization

various departments, including the Financial Aid Office, must have authorization from a student to be able to release information to any third party (this includes parents, spouses, and people paying the tuition bill). It's similar to how HIPPA Privacy protects your health information at a hospital or doctor's office.

Due to FERPA, if a student does not complete the **FERPA Consent to Release** form, **we cannot communicate with anyone but the student** regarding a student's financial aid or other sensitive information. Students can complete the FERPA Consent to Release in the **Records and Registration tab** of the **myUCCS Student Portal**. There a student can list the name and information of anyone they wish to give this consent to. Students will also need to create a password that must be given to the person(s) whom they are giving consent. Third parties will be asked to identify themselves and to give us the password listed in order for us to release financial aid information.

If a student does NOT elect to give this authorization or fails to complete the release form, **only the student** will be able to inquire about their financial aid information in detail.



On **DECEMBER 1st**, the **2020-2021 UCCS Scholarship Application** opens and the scholarship hunt for next year begins! Here are just a few tips to keep in mind while applying for scholarships:

APPLY FOR EVERYTHING!

If you think you are eligible to receive the scholarship, apply for it!

COMPLETE THE APPLICATION

If something is not applicable on the application, mark it as N/A or "does not apply." Do not leave lines blank.

FOLLOW DIRECTIONS

Do not supply things that are not requested (i.e. transcripts and resumes).

NEATNESS COUNTS

Make photocopies for working drafts. Save everything!

• MAKE SURE TO LEAVE AN IMPRESSION

Be personal and specific. Be complete and concise, but also creative!

• WATCH ALL DEADLINES

Do not wait until the last minute!

• GIVE YOUR APPLICATION A "ONCE-OVER" BEFORE SUBMITTING

Proofread (and have someone else proofread) the entire application carefully!

Now is the Time to POUNCE on Financial Aid Opportunities!

Did you know that you could miss out on **over \$9000.00 of grant money** by doing the FAFSA even **one day too** late?

It's true! It's part of the reason you want to complete the FAFSA in the **fall semester** of each year! Applying for financial aid **early** is one of the best things a student can do to **maximize their financial aid opportunities** and have **greater peace of mind**. It also allows the financial aid staff the most amount of time to assist you if you have questions or concerns. Here are the **two most important financial aid dates** for the fall semester. Take out your planner, open your calendar app on your phone, or find a piece of paper to jot these dates down now. Go ahead, we'll wait...

You ready? Ok, here they are:

October 1: The 2020-2021 FAFSA can be completed.

December 1: The UCCS Scholarship Application is available.

You want to get started with these **as soon as possible** and complete them both no later than **March 1**

Yes, that is **every year**!
